JUST A THOUGHT . . . (a slow meander through Mark) Read Mark 7:14-15

Jesus is speaking to people who had certain ideas about purity. A common one was that spiritual purity could be defiled by external realities (eating with unwashed hands, eating unclean foods, etc.). Jesus has a more disturbing understanding of human impurity: it comes from within, from the heart. We can think that if we avoid 'defiling things,' then we are pure. "Not so" says Jesus.

How do I respond to Jesus saying that my problem is not with my environment, but with me?
