JUST A THOUGHT . . . (a slow meander through Mark) Read Mark 8:14-21

The disciples feel ill-prepared with only one loaf of bread to eat. Jesus expects better from them because they had witnessed his power to feed thousands with a meal made for a few. What could this be but dull unbelief, the kind of response that Jesus expected from the Pharisees and Herod?! (See Mark 6:14-29) He goes through all his recent miracles with them, but they still don't get it.

Please pray for these men as they wait to start the next stage of their lives.
